- Be working with children either in a public-school classroom, our early childhood center, or at a public agency
- Be provided with a full semester of professional experience before student teaching through our unique TOTAL (Teachers of Tomorrow Advancing Learning) program
- Receive a full semester of student teaching experience following the TOTAL semester
- Have the opportunity to personally experience another culture through international student teaching programs
- Begin working towards admission to the [Becoming a Complete Professional \(BCP\) Program](#) which is a critical benchmark for teacher candidates

Characteristics of Teacher Education at ISU

Field Based Courses of Teacher Education

All the sophomore and junior level education courses include at least 12–20 hours for students' field experience.

Senior level courses (i.e., 400 level) include at least 28 hrs. per week x 12 weeks = TOTAL 336 hrs. for the first semester of senior year (i.e., TOTAL program) and student teaching for the entire second semester.

Volunteering Spirit for the Community

Sophomore or junior level education course faculty members ask students to do the course-related volunteering works for the community such as working at public library education programs, a local children's museum and after-school programs.
